Seizures of 7 year-old Not Prevented by Medications

Alexis Baffles the Experts as Seizures Stop after Jaudy Treatments

It is amazing to realize what a difference five months can make. Last October, my seven-year-old daughter began treatments with Dr. Jaudy to stop her seizures. For eighteen months, Alexis ingested medication daily to control the seizures, but a recent EEG showed conclusively that she was still having seizures. This meant the medication was failing. As the neurologist began talking ominously of "other options", such as getting Alexis pre-evaluated for brain surgery, I began a feverish search for alternatives.

Now that I know more than I ever wanted to about seizures, I learned that not every seizure is a grand mal episode with a person shaking on the ground. I never really knew Alexis had seizures until her teacher mentioned that she would stare off into space as if she were in a hypnotic trance several times throughout the day. Her "spells" lasted for 5-10 seconds each and I just thought I had a daydreamer for a daughter.

Alexis was referred to a world-renowned specialist after we failed two medications and our neurologist wanted us to seek a higher level of care. Since we could not get in for an appointment with the specialist for four months, we figured we had nothing to lose if we tried Dr. Jaudy in the meantime.

As I made my first 3 1/2 hour round trip trek to Palm Desert seeking the good doctor's wisdom, I remember thinking that this better be worth it! It was and it is because Dr. Jaudy listens to me, talks to me like I'm an intelligent being and inspires confidence because he actually knows what he is doing. My experience is that these are rare traits in a medical professional.

There were times over the last few months when I wondered if all of our efforts were for naught. But, we stuck with it and came to realize that it is unrealistic to expect a condition to be fixed in one month when it probably developed over years, not months. In this context, it is miraculous to me that we were able to get the results we hoped for in a few short months. Last, January, I got the proof I wanted when the specialist finally met with me. Alexis was checked into the UCLA hospital in Los Angeles for a three day monitoring EEG followed by an MRI. The purpose of the test was to try to pinpoint where the seizures were located in the brain and the type of seizure. For 24 hours daily electrodes were scanning her brain. The doctors were a bit puzzled, so they ordered an MRI to verify their initial conclusions. They finally met with us and admitted that they were baffled as to why we were there, since she exhibited NO SIGNS OF SEIZURE

ACTIVITY! I confirmed that her two previous EEG's over the last eighteen months showed proof of definite seizures. The specialist and his umpteen interns and residents (there were eight doctors in the room - I guess we were a "teaching opportunity") had no explanation for Alexis's condition. He told me to "just keep doing whatever it is you are doing".

My thought was that God answered our prayers and sent us Dr. Jaudy. For a brief three months, a lot of time and effort went into getting Alexis well. Currently, we see Dr.

Jaudy every two or three weeks. I'm eternally grateful that our family took a leap of faith and tried an alternative to achieve wellness. Other doctors offered us pills and surgery, but Dr. Jaudy solved our problem and gave us the keys to optimal health.

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
